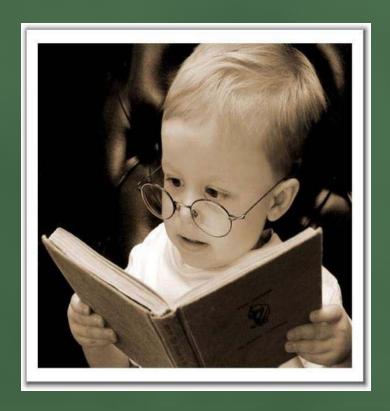

Preparing for the Test

- Set a "realistic" study schedule and begin studying early
- Identify what concepts are most important
- Try to identify the content of the questions you will be asked



Preparing for the Test

- Do not simply memorize facts
- Actively summarize
- Study with other wellprepared students
- Review past tests (if possible)



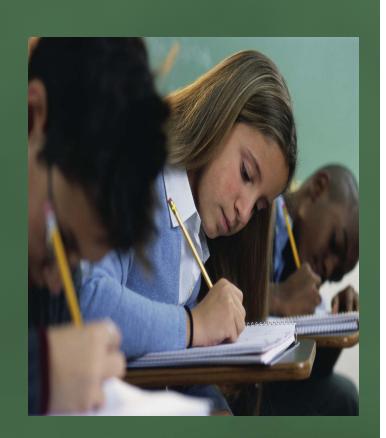
Controlling Anxiety

- Be prepared emotionally and physically, as well as intellectually
- Stay away from others right before the test
- Arrive at the test room early
- Do not forget writing utensils, erasers, calculators, and reading glasses if necessary
- Don't expect to know everything



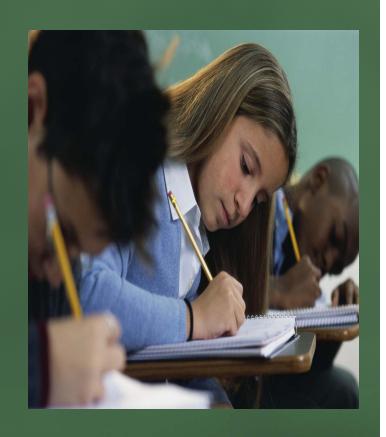
Strategy: READ each question carefully

- Identify key words
- Identify what is being asked
- Underline key words (if possible)



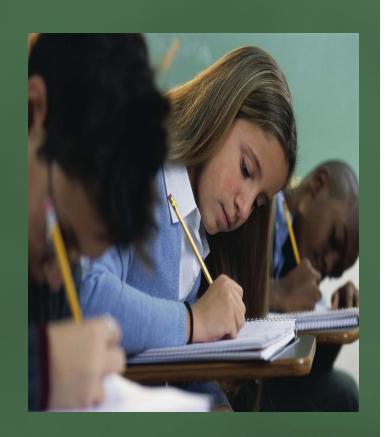
Strategy: Cover-Up!

- Always cover up the possible responses with a piece of paper or with your hand while you read the stem, or body of the question.
- Then, come up with the answer in your head before looking at the possible answers



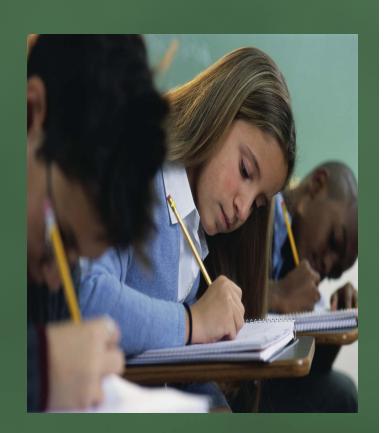
Multiple Choice Strategy: Pace Yourself

- Don't spend too much time on any one question
- Do your best and then move on
- If you are completely unsure, skip it, but be sure to go back.



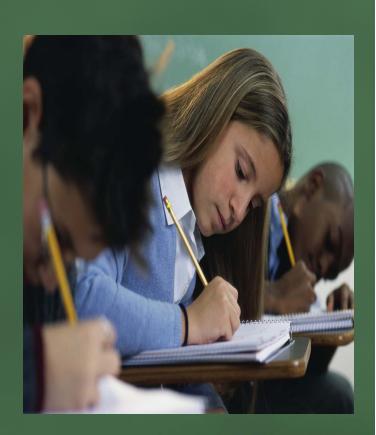
Strategy: *** Star Questions ***

- If you are unsure, answer and star the question
- Come back to "star" questions at the end of the test



Strategy: Help From Your Neighbour?

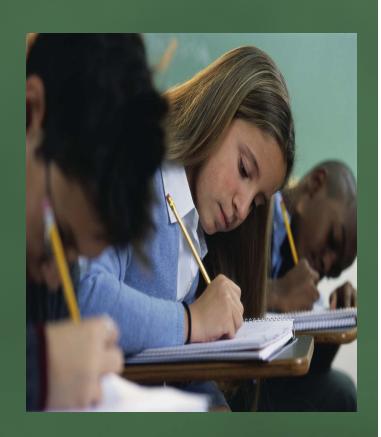
- Neighbouring questions, of course!
- Use other questions to help



Strategy: Do NOT Leave Any B_ n _ !

 If there is no guessing penalty always take an educated guess and select an answer

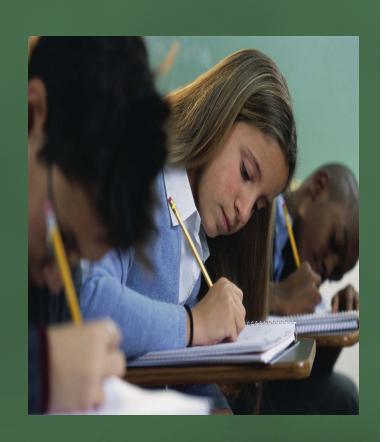
Try to answer every question



Strategy: Never Change Answers

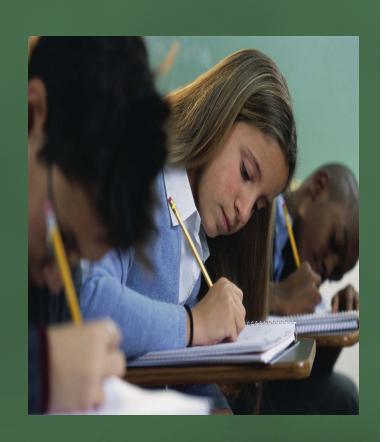
 Don't keep on changing your answer, usually your first choice is the right one

 UNLESS you are 100% sure you made a mistake do not change your answer



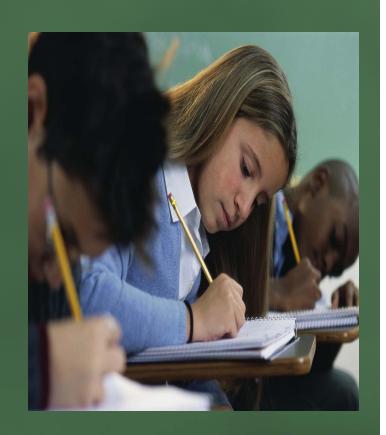
Strategy: Process of Elimination

- If you have some knowledge about the question, eliminate choices that you know are incorrect
- If you can eliminate two wrong answers, your chance of choosing the right answer is greater



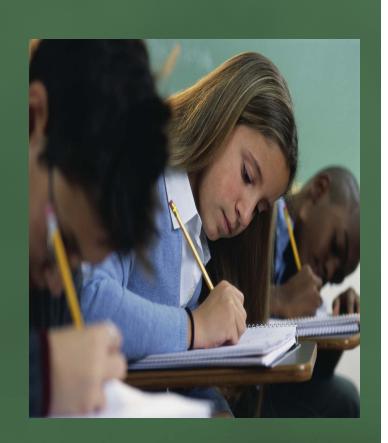
Strategy: Answer the Question

Even though an answer is a correct statement, <u>it must</u>
 answer the question, if it doesn't answer the question, it is not the correct answer



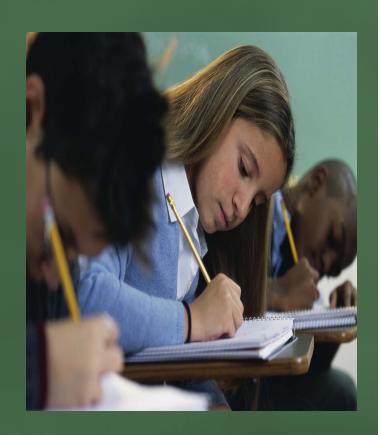
Strategy: "All of the Above" Choice

- In a question with an "All of the above" choice, if you see at least two correct statements, then "All of the above" is probably the answer
- One of the statements is false don't chose "All of the above"



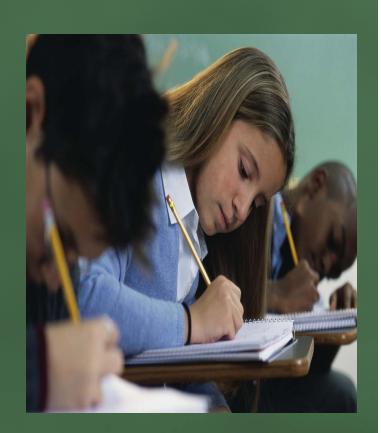
Strategy: "None of the above" Choice

 If you are certain one of the statements is true don't chose "None of the above"



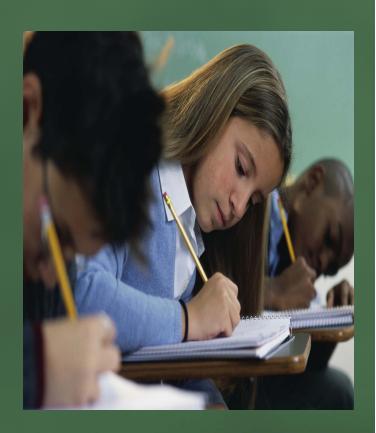
Strategy: Cross Out Questions

- Start with the easy questions.
- If you are confident you have the right answer, cross out the question and don't go back.



Multiple Choice Strategy: NO Patterns!

• Do not look for patterns in your answer sheet.



The single best way to do well on tests is to know the right answers!
