



Transportation details for the 2017 - 2018 school year will be available on Monday August 21, 2017.

Parents can login and view your child's transportation details by going to www.stswr.ca and follow these easy steps:

- Click on "Student Login"
- Click on "Student Login" again (near the bottom of the page)
 - Enter your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) This can be found on your child's report card.
 - Numbers only, no space, no dash
 - Enter your child's birth date > dd/mm/yyyy
 - Enter your child's house number only
- Select the school your child is attending from the drop down menu

Please note: any address changes need to be done through your school. If you are moving this summer or change caregiver arrangements for the fall, you should communicate the change of address to your child's school as soon as possible.

Rules of Conduct for Students Using Bus Transportation

1. Every student is responsible to the Principal for her/his conduct on the bus.
2. Students must act appropriately so as not to endanger the safety or comfort of themselves or others.
3. Students at all times are to obey the driver who is in charge of the bus and all passengers.
4. Students are to sit or stand where directed by the driver.
5. The following examples of behaviour (not all-inclusive) on a bus are prohibited at all times:
 - a) unnecessary opening and closing of windows;
 - b) fighting, wrestling, yelling, climbing;
 - c) smoking or using an e-cigarette
 - d) throwing articles;
 - e) using obscene or profane language;
 - f) vandalism (students guilty of vandalism will have to make restitution.)

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES AND SUSPENSION OF RIDING PRIVILEGES

1. The driver will warn any student whose behaviour is inappropriate on a school bus.
2. If the misbehaviour is repeated, the driver shall submit a report to the Principal who shall interview the student and may warn her/his parents that further repetition could lead to the withdrawal of riding privileges.
3. If a suspension of riding privileges is to be applied to a student:
 - a) The parents are to be notified, in writing, of the reason and duration of the suspension of riding privileges. The suspension of riding privileges, by the Principal, will be for a period of one (1) to twenty (20) days for any one offence. Persistent violations may result in a permanent withdrawal of riding privileges. When the situation warrants, in addition to suspending riding privileges, the Principal may also suspend the student from school. The Principal may require a meeting with the parents before allowing the student to resume riding the school bus.
 - b) The Co-operative Transportation Department of the Board and the operator of the bus company will receive a copy of the letter.
4. If the Principal feels that the misbehaviour is sufficiently serious to suspend the student's riding privileges immediately, the parents will be contacted by phone, followed by written notice.

SCHOOL BUS PROCEDURES:

1. When, in the opinion of the driver, a student's misconduct is sufficiently serious, the student may be asked to leave the bus. The driver will then contact a Transit supervisor and/or the police. The supervisor/or police will then assist the student to get to the school or home. The incident will be reported to the Principal for disposition and the student's bus privileges may be suspended.
2. When, in the opinion of the bus driver, the misbehaviour of the student is jeopardizing the safety of others, and the student or students responsible cannot be identified, the driver will either stop the bus until an inspector arrives or return to the school. The bus must not proceed until those responsible have been identified and removed.
