COURSE OFFERINGS 2019 – 2020

Course selection is an important time to choose wisely for next year. The final decision on course selection for students under 18 years of age rests with parent/guardians. Therefore, keeping in touch with your child's guidance counsellor and teachers is important. Consideration of the student's achievement for the past several years and the advice of the school, will help in choosing a program for which your child can achieve success.

Course selection sheets are an important vehicle for the educational planning process and are required each year. It is the responsibility of all students and their parents/guardians to complete course selections by the prescribed date.

Changes to a student's timetable will be made for sound educational reasons only and are dependent upon course availability and time.

Please note that in some cases, courses will be cancelled when there are not enough students enrolled in a particular course.



Students must complete 30 credits as part of the requirements for the OSSD. This includes 18 compulsory credits and 12 elective credits.

COMPULSORY CREDITS:

- 4 credits in English (**1 credit per grade**)
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 3 credits in Mathematics
(at least one credit in grade's 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the Arts
- 1 credit in Health & Physical Education
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics

PLUS

GROUP ONE: 1 additional credit in English, or French as a second language** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language or social sciences and the humanities or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education or cooperative education.

GROUP TWO: 1 additional credit in health and physical education or the arts or business studies or French as a second language** or cooperative education***

GROUP THREE: 1 additional credit in science (grade 11 or 12) or technological education or French as a second language** or computer studies or cooperative education***

* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

**In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

***A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

+The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

ELECTIVE CREDITS AND ADDITIONAL OSSD REQUIREMENTS:

- 12 optional credits (including 1 **Religion** course each year)
- complete **40 hours of community involvement** activities
- successfully complete the **provincial secondary school literacy requirement**

- Signed Course selection sheets are due **March 1st** to the classroom teacher.

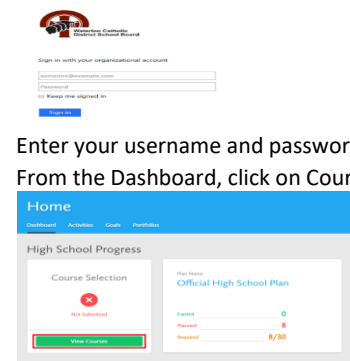

1. Go to www.myBlueprint.ca/
2. Click the School Account Login. (Green button.)
3. Enter your username and password. (Same as school computers.)
4. From the Dashboard, click on Course Selection.



5. Add courses to your High School Plan. Click on + Course to select from courses at Doyle.
6. Click on Review Course Selections to review your chosen courses.
7. Click Submit Course Selections to submit courses.
8. Click Print Sign-Off Sheet to print a copy.
9. Have your parent/guardian sign your sheet and return it to your teacher. Signed Course Selections must be completed and submitted by: **Friday March 1st**.
