Students must complete 30 credits as part of the requirements for the OSSD. This includes 19 compulsory credits and 11 elective credits.

- 1 credit in Technology (grade 9 or 10)
- **0.5** credit in Career Studies
- **0.5** credit in Civics

PLUS:

GROUP ONE: 1 additional credit in English, or French as a second language** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language or social sciences and the humanities or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education or cooperative education. GROUP TWO: 1 additional credit in health and physical education or the arts or business studies or French as a second language** or cooperative education***

GROUP THREE: 1 additional credit in science (grade 11 or 12) or technological education or French as a second language** or computer studies or cooperative education***

- * A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
- **In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group
- ***A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits. +The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

ELECTIVE CREDITS AND ADDITIONAL OSSD REQUIREMENTS:

- 11 elective credits (including 1 **Religion** course each year).
- Complete 40 hours of Community Involvement activities (submit to Guidance before May 1st of Graduating Year).
- Successfully complete the provincial secondary school literacy requirement.
- Complete two online learning courses (taken at any point in your high school years). This can include summer school elearning courses.
