What Grade 9 students need to know...

What do students need to graduate?

To obtain your Ontario Secondary Schools Diploma (OSSD), students must:

- 1) Successfully pass 30 credits (18 compulsory and 12 electives)
- 2) Complete the Provincial Literacy Requirement (Grade 10)
- 3) Complete 40 hours of Community Service
- 4) Complete 2 online learning credits (opt out available)



What courses are compulsory?


- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in Mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the Arts
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics

Plus <u>one</u> credit from each of the following groups:

- GROUP 1: additional credit in English, or French as a second language,** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education***
- GROUP 2: additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a second language,** or cooperative education***
- GROUP 3: additional credit in science (Grade 11 or 12), or technological education, or French as a second language,** or computer studies, or cooperative education***

What courses will I need in grade 10?

- English (applied, academic, locally developed)
- Religion (open)
- Math (applied, academic, locally developed)
- Science (applied, academic, locally developed)
- History (applied, academic, locally developed)
- Civics and Career Studies
 (half credit courses open)
- Plus 2 Elective courses (do you have your phys.ed and art course done)?



How do I make my course level decisions for grade 10?

- 1) The level of study you choose should be based on previous courses. Do you have the pre-requisite?
- 2) Where do you see yourself immediately after grade 12? Which pathway are you headed towards (apprenticeship, college, community, university or work)?
- 3) Reflect on your grade 9 year. How's it going? How do you learn best?
- 4) What are your work habits like?
- 5) What is your attendance like?





Locally Developed Courses


- Offered in English, Math, Science, History (not all classes must be the same level).
- Designed to focus on core knowledge and skills to meet individual needs.
- Student must be on an IEP
- Class size is smaller, more individualized attention.
- Courses lead to apprenticeship, some foundational college programs and the workplace.



Applied Level Courses


- Offered in English, Math, Science, History (not all classes must be the same level).
- Courses focus on key concepts of a subject.
- Real-life situations will be used to illustrate ideas; students will be given more opportunities to experience practical, hands-on application of concepts.

Courses lead to apprenticeship, college or the workplace.




Academic Level Courses


- Offered in English, Math, Science, History (not all classes must be the same level).
- Courses focus on key concepts of a subject and explore related subjects too.
- Emphasize theoretical, abstract applications of the key concepts while incorporating practical applications.
- Class sizes are larger; independent work habits are a must.
- Courses lead to apprenticeship, college, university or the workplace.






STEP 2: From the Dashboard, click on Plan Courses







STEP 3: Add courses to your High School Plan. Click on + Course to select from courses at your school.






STEP 4: Click on Review Course Selections to review your chosen courses




STEP 5: Click Submit Course Selections to submit courses to your school






STEP 6: Click Send Approval Email to send your course requests to parent/guardian to approve them.




