Course selection is an important time to choose wisely for next year. The final decision on course selection for students under 18 years of age rests with parent/guardians. Therefore, keeping in touch with your child's guidance counsellor and teachers is important. Consideration of the student's achievement for the past several years and information from the school, will help in choosing a program for which your child can achieve success.

Course selection is an important vehicle for the educational planning process and is required each year. It is the responsibility of all students and their parents/guardians to complete course selections by the prescribed date.

Changes to a student's timetable will be made for sound educational reasons only and are dependent upon course availability and location. It is not always possible to make changes. It is very important to think about your course choices during course selection time including Pathway considerations for your future.

Please note that in some cases, courses will be cancelled when there are not enough students enrolled. As well, course enrollment totals will be set for specialized programs. Please submit your course selection on time to be considered for these.

Important Course Selection Information

- Log on to myBlueprint.ca beginning February 1st to select courses electronically.

- Guidance counsellors will support students with my-Blueprint electronic submission during Semester 2.
- Course selection is due **March 1st** electronically through myBlueprint. Students must enter parent's email address so parents can approve course selections electronically.

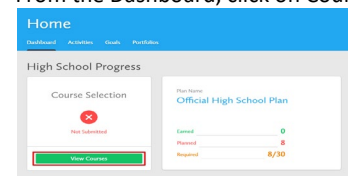

COURSE SELECTION INSTRUCTIONS

- Go to your WCDSB my apps page (<https://www.wcdsb.ca/students/>) and choose myBlueprint icon.
- From the Dashboard, click on Course Selection.



- Add courses to your High School Plan. Click on + Course to select from courses at Doyle.
- Click on Review Course Selections to review your chosen courses.
- Click Submit Course Selections to lock course choices in.
- Input parent email when prompted.
- Have your parent/guardian approve your choices electronically by **March 1st**

OSSD Requirements (enter grade 9 in 2023 or earlier)

(Students must complete 30 credits as part of the requirements for the OSSD. This includes 18 compulsory credits and 12 elective credits.)

COMPULSORY CREDITS:

- 4 credits in English (**1 credit per grade**)
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 3 credits in Mathematics
(at least one credit in grade's 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the Arts
- 1 credit in Health & Physical Education
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics

PLUS:

GROUP ONE: 1 additional credit in English, or French as a second language** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language or social sciences and the humanities or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education or cooperative education.

GROUP TWO: 1 additional credit in health and physical education or the arts or business studies or French as a second language** or cooperative education***

GROUP THREE: 1 additional credit in science (grade 11 or 12) or technological education or French as a second language** or computer studies or cooperative education***

* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

**In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

***A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits. +The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

ELECTIVE CREDITS & ADDITIONAL OSSD REQUIREMENTS:

- 12 elective credits (including 1 Religion course each year).
- Complete **40 hours of Community Involvement** activities (submit to Guidance before May 1st of Graduating Year).
- Successfully complete the **provincial secondary school literacy requirement**.
- Complete **two online learning courses** (taken at any point in your high school years). This can include summer school e-learning courses.

OSSD Requirements (enter grade 9 in 2024 or after)

17 Compulsory Credits: Same as those listed above with these changes.

- Addition of 1 credit technology in gr. 9/10
- Removal of Group 1, 2 and 3 compulsory credits
- Addition of 1 credit from the STEM-related Group (Business, computers, cooperative education, additional mathematics or science, additional technology credit beyond compulsory)

13 elective credits: Chosen from any department of interest.

All other OSSD requirements remain the same: (40 hours Community Service, OSSLT requirement, 2 online learning courses).
